- ➤ Become aware of the substance abuse problem in our society and how it affects our families, communities and ourselves.
- ➤ Become informed as to the facts and be ready to dispel the myths about alcohol and other drug use so that the subject can be freely discussed within the family unit and in community settings.
- ➤ Recognize that the role of community member and parent requires responsible behavior and clear positions regarding alcohol and other drug use in our own family and within the community.
- ➤ Help youth become capable adults by providing opportunities that promote positive self-image and critical life skills.
- Encourage and sponsor creative social activities that are drug-free in setting.
- ➤ Encourage parents to host well supervised parties for youth that limit the number of guests to a controllable number and work to develop family standards that prohibit the use of alcohol and other drugs by adolescents in the home, at any time.

- Request and endorse comprehensive prevention programs for grades K
 12 that deal with alcohol and other drugs in the local school system.
